Fall Trimester web registration begins on May 27 and ends September 3. AugNet registration opens each day below for the new class at 8:30 a.m.

Class start dates are one day apart and will follow this schedule:

TUESDAY, MAY 27 - SENIORS AND GRADUATE STUDENTS

WEDNESDAY, MAY 28 - JUNIORS, LICENSURE, AND NON-DEGREE SEEKING STUDENTS

THURSDAY, MAY 29 - SOPHOMORES

FRIDAY, MAY 30 - FRESHMEN

The last day for initial registration (must be registered for 1 course) for Minneapolis/United Fall Trimester is the last business day before the term begins: Thursday, September 4, 2008.

The last day to readmit to the Minneapolis/United Augsburg for Adult programs for Fall Trimester (and register for at least 1 course) is the last business day before the term begins: Thursday, September 4, 2008.

Please note that registration for SSII online will be suspended the weekend of May 23 and will reopen on the schedule listed above.

Students are encouraged to register early as course availability decreases greatly after the first two weeks of the registration period.
