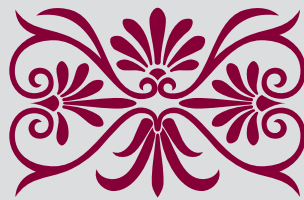

“The Physician Assistant’s Role in the Medical Profession—and Augsburg’s Graduate Program”

The Associates' Fall Luncheon will be held on October 6th. Dr. Alicia Quella, Associate Professor and Program Director at the Augsburg College Physician Assistant Program, will be the guest speaker at the annual fall luncheon. We will hear about the Program and of Dr. Quella's interests that directed her into the field of public health. She began in public health while working as a US Peace Corps volunteer in the Central African Republic.

Dr. Quella graduated from the University of Iowa Physician Assistant Program in 1999 and later received a doctorate in epidemiology in 2010. As a faculty member, she enjoys teaching emergency medicine subjects, such as psychiatric and toxicological emergencies. Her research interests include medical errors, physician assistants in global health, and PA workforce issues. The AAPA Global Grant allowed her to travel with PA students to Lao People's Democratic Republic. She and her fellow travelers engaged with and taught local PA students. We are fortunate to have Dr. Quella speak to us at our Fall Lunch.

The luncheon will take place at the Town & Country Club in St. Paul; the annual meeting prior to lunch. We will also hear an update from the College. Adamo, Professor of History and Medieval Studies, who is also the Director of Honors and a 2015 and 2015 Minnesota Professor of the Year, was our speaker on Augsburg's past. Adamo is working with students to write a college history for the celebration of Augsburg's sesquicentennial.

ASSOCIATE ESTATE/MOVING SALES UPDATE

After several years of not conducting our Estate and Moving sales, the Associates responded to a request this spring to conduct a sale in May. Without a designated estate sales coordinator, it was decided to try the team approach, with Associate members being responsible for different areas of responsibility. There was a quick and excellent response from our membership to volunteer at this sale. In fact, we ended up with a total of 34 volunteers, including 6 men!! We are happy to report that an amount of over \$11,000 was received from the sale, with the Associates receiving 33% to provide student scholarship assistance. Following a post-sale meeting to evaluate all that went into this sale, the Board voted at its June Board meeting to move forward in considering other requests for estate and moving sales using the team approach. We acknowledge that the team approach needs some "fine tuning" and we will work toward that effort.
