

## Transfer Guide for Saint Paul College

This transfer guide directs students to courses that fulfill specific Liberal Arts Foundation requirements. Also included are approved courses that meet other requirements of Augsburg's Core Curriculum. Certain elements of Augsburg's Core Curriculum must be completed at Augsburg and cannot be completed with transfer coursework.

***Liberal Arts Foundation:*** Students must complete coursework in four foundation areas. Each area requires two courses from different departments. Approved transfer courses are listed below.

**Natural Sciences and Mathematics** – Two courses from different departments. At least one course must be an approved lab science. Approved lab sciences are noted below.

**BIOL** 1725 (lab), 1730 (lab), 1735 (lab), 1740 (lab), 1745 (lab), 1785, 2721 (lab), 2722 (lab)

**CHEM** 1700 (lab), 1711 (lab), 1712 (lab)

**MATH** 1710, 1730, 1740, 1760, 2751, 2752

**NSCI\*** 1710 (lab), 1720, 1730, 1740, 1750, 1770

**PHYS** 1720 (lab), 2700 (lab), 2710 (lab) or **NSCI** 1760

\*These courses are classified as general science (**SCI**) when transferred to Augsburg.

**Social and Behavioral Sciences** – Two courses from different departments.

**ECON** 1710, 1720, 1730

**POLS** 1720, 1750

**PSYC** 1710, 1720

**SOCI\*** 1710, 1720 or **ANTH\*** 1710

\*Augsburg does not have an Anthropology department. Sociology and Anthropology courses are classified under the same department.

**Fine Arts** – Two courses from different departments.

**ARTS** 1710, 1720, 1730, 1740, 1760, 1770, 1790

**MUSC** 1740, 1750

**THTR** 1710, 1720 or **HUMA** 1770, 1780, 1790

**Humanities** – Two courses from different departments.

**ENGL** 1780, 1790, 2721, 2722, 2730, 2740, 2750, 2760, 2770, 2775, 2778

**HIST** 1730, 1741, 1742, 1750, 1760, 1761, 1770, 2740

**HUMA** 1710, 1720, 1730

**PHIL** 1700, 1710, 1720, 1760\*

**SPCH** 1700, 1710, 1740

\*PHIL 1760 equates to a Religion course (REL356) at Augsburg. Therefore, a student may take a second PHIL course from this listing.

### ***Other transferable requirements in the Core Curriculum***

**Entry-level Mathematics Skill** – All entering Augsburg students who have not taken a college-level math course in the last five years must take Augsburg's math placement exam. Students must score into Math Placement Group 3 (MPG3) or take *MAT105 Applied Algebra* at Augsburg. The following courses at Saint Paul College, when taken within the last 5 years, will exempt a student from taking the math placement exam.

**MATH** 1730, 1760, 2751 or 2752

**Effective Writing** – Successful completion of **ENGL 1711** at Saint Paul College will fulfill this requirement.

**Modern Language** – All students must study a modern language through at least level two (e.g. Beginning French I & II). Saint Paul College offers the following courses that apply to this requirement:

**ASLS** 1411, 1412, 1413, 1414

**SPAN** 1710, 1720, 1730, 1740

**Critical Thinking Graduation-level Skill** – Successful completion of **PHIL 1710** at Saint Paul College will fulfill this requirement.

**Speaking Graduation-level Skill** – Successful completion of **SPCH 1710** at Saint Paul College will fulfill this requirement.

**Quantitative Reasoning Graduation-level Skill** – Successful completion of **MATH 1740** at Saint Paul College will fulfill this requirement.

# AUGSBURG COLLEGE

## ***Transfer Policies and Credit Information***

College credit is granted for liberal arts courses completed at regionally accredited institutions with a grade of 2.0/C or better. Augsburg does not grant transfer credit for developmental courses, vocational-technical courses, or courses with grades below 2.0/C. Augsburg operates on a course credit system, rather than semester or quarter hours. One Augsburg course credit is equivalent to four semester hours. A maximum of 64 semester hours (16 Augsburg course credits) may be transferred from 2-year institutions. Courses taken beyond the credit limit can, however, be used to meet liberal arts and major requirements.

## ***Minnesota Transfer Curriculum (MnTC)***

Students who have completed their Associate of Arts degree with the MnTC and a cumulative grade point average of 2.5 or higher will receive the following benefits upon acceptance to the Augsburg:

- Junior Status
- Waiver of Liberal Arts Foundation requirements
- Waiver of the following Graduation-level Skill requirements: Critical Thinking, Speaking, and one course in Writing

Students are then responsible for:

- Meeting the requirements of an Augsburg major
- Satisfying minimum credit, residency, and G.P.A. requirements for graduation
- Meeting all general education requirements not completed or waived with previous transfer coursework

**Note: the A.A. degree and MnTC must be completed prior to enrollment at Augsburg.**

## ***About Augsburg College***

Augsburg College is a private, liberal arts college associated with the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America. The college offers its 3,500 students a choice of two programs: Day or Weekend. Students in the Day program can choose from over 50 majors offered on campus and through the Associated Colleges of the Twin Cities. Students in Weekend College take courses on a weekend/evening schedule and can choose from the 19 majors available.
