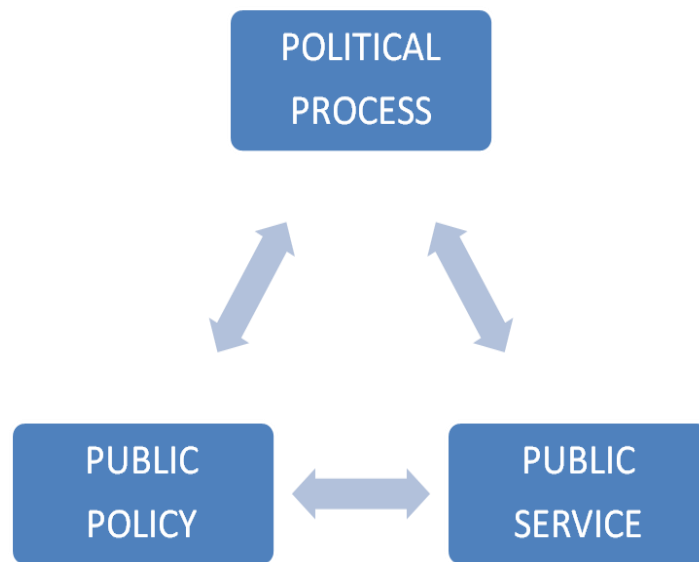

SABO SCHOLARS/SCHOLARSHIP:

- 5 Seniors and 5 Juniors who demonstrate an interest and commitment to engagement in the political process, public policy and/or careers in public service
- \$2000 scholarship for each Sabo Scholar [divided equally between the 2 semesters]
[Additional funding may be available to expand participation thru Internships]

Expectatons of SABO SCHOLARS:

- Collaborate with Representative Martin Sabo, Sabo Professor Garry Hesser, and Senior Faculty Fellows to identify and create opportunities for Augsburg students to engage more fully in the three areas to which the Sabo Center is committed [above];
- Help to shape the present endeavors and future direction of the Sabo Center;
- Collaborate with other scholars to promote these three areas among students; and
- Meet monthly with Representative Sabo, Sabo Professor Hesser, Sr. Fellows & local alums and persons engaged in public service, policy related work and political process.

Expectations [elaborated] of SABO SCHOLARS:

- 1) Identify a minimum of one critical public issue/problem that you are concerned about [complete a-c and discuss with Sabo Professor/Faculty Fellow/Sr. Fellow during the first month of Fall Semester & review at beginning of Spring Term]
 - a) Describe its scope and impacts as you currently understand it [1 page]
 - b) Investigate and describe the major public policies and strategies that are currently addressing “your” issue at different levels of governance [2-3 pages]
 - Federal government
 - State government
 - Local government
 - c) Identify a brief list of what individuals also do/might do to address that issue, actions that illustrate agency, co-creation and vocation[2-3 pages]:
 - Professional public service careers
 - Elected officials
 - Citizens
 - d) Identify ways to involve other Augsburg students in learning/action regarding “your” issue/problem
- 2) Actively involve yourself in the Sabo Public Policy Symposia
 - a) Assisting Elaine, Senior/Faculty Fellows in planning and execution of each one
 - b) Attending and assisting on day of event
 - c) Recruiting a minimum of 6 other students [along with faculty, staff, others]
 - d) Join other Scholars in pre and post-event discussions on the topic
- 3) Internships exploring careers in Public Service and the Political arena
 - a) Actively explore possibilities making use of Strommen Center & faculty advising
 - b) Secure and carry out at least one Internship during your Junior or Senior year
- 4) Identify yourself publically as a Sabo Scholar in discussions and on resumes, being a spokesperson for the Sabo Center and its endeavors wherever possible
- 5) Meet monthly with Representative Sabo, Sabo Professor, Sr. Fellows & local alums and persons engaged in public service, policy related work and political process.
