APPLICATION PROCESS

- 1. Be admitted to Augsburg College
- 2. Complete an Augsburg TRIO/SSS application. All eligible admitted students will receive a link to the TRIO/SSS Summer Bridge application.
- Complete the 2017-18 Free Application for Federal Student Aid (FAFSA) and complete the 2016-17 FAFSA in order to receive financial aid for summer 2017.

The **deadline** for Summer Bridge 2017 applications and Summer Bridge Promise Grant consideration is **Friday, March 31, 2017**.

WHAT IS TRIO/SSS SUMMER BRIDGE?

The Augsburg TRIO/Student Support Services (SSS) Summer Bridge program gives first-year TRIO/SSS eligible students a head start on their Augsburg education for a smooth transition to Augsburg in the fall. After Summer Bridge, students continue to participate in TRIO/SSS while enrolled at Augsburg.

WHY SUMMER BRIDGE?

Summer Bridge is a great way to begin your Auggie experience! As a Summer Bridge participant, you:

- Complete two Augsburg courses for credit
- Live on campus in a residence hall
- Learn and develop valuable study skills that will be useful throughout college
- Participate in academic seminars, workshops, and activities designed to familiarize you with Augsburg and Minneapolis
- Begin college with a great group of classmates

There are no out of pocket costs for Summer Bridge and financial aid will be awarded to those who qualify.*

SUMMER BRIDGE 2017

The five-week Summer Bridge program includes a mix of academic and social activities:

- REL 100: Religion, Vocation, and the Search for Meaning I and COM 111: Public Speaking courses
- Supplemental Instruction (SI) seminars and daily structured study groups
- Meetings with TRIO/SSS advisors to set and achieve goals for academic success
- Volunteer work with the Campus Kitchen project
- Daily interaction with Augsburg faculty and support staff
- Peer and professional mentoring

Room and Board, textbooks, and other supplies are provided.

Summer Bridge meets daily and attendance is required at all program activities. The Summer Bridge schedule is rigorous; students may not be absent for activities such as work, family vacations, etc. Please keep this in mind before deciding to apply for Summer Bridge.

Summer Bridge students also are expected to:

- Participate in TRIO/SSS each year until graduation, including: weekly fall meetings with your TRIO/SSS advisor; attendance at a minimum of two TRIO/SSS workshops per term; other services outlined during TRIO/SSS orientation
- Comply with all rules and regulations of Augsburg College and TRIO/SSS



PROGRAM ELIGIBILITY

Augsburg TRIO/SSS participants must be **U.S. citizens** or permanent residents or refugees pursuing their first bachelor's degree. Program participants must demonstrate academic need for services and meet at least one of the following criteria:

• First generation college student: a student whose (custodial) parents have not received a bachelor's degree or a student who did not regularly live with or receive support from a (custodial) parent

- Low-income student: a student whose family meets federal income eligibility guidelines as verified by Augsburg College
- College student with **documented disabilities:** as defined in the Americans with Disabilities Act (ADA) and verified by Augsburg's Center for Learning and Accessible Student Services (CLASS) office

Students must also demonstrate commitment to their college success.
