
What do you enjoy doing in your free time?

The 2023-2024 Multicultural Life Scholarship Application is now open! The deadline to submit your application is **February 5, 2023** at 5pm CST. If you have any questions, you can email mlife@augsburg.edu.

First-Time Applicants Eligibility Criteria:

Must have completed at least one full semester at Augsburg by the 2023-2024 academic semester. Be enrolled as a full-time student in the Augsburg Day program for the 23-24 academic year. Meet a minimum cumulative GPA of 2.5. Meet the University's standard of conduct. Complete this application by the deadline. Must demonstrate financial need, defined by Student Financial Services.

DACA and undocumented and International Students (F-1 and J-1) students are eligible and highly encouraged to apply.

** ActSix, American Indian Tuition Recognition Program, Presidential, and Promise Scholarship recipient are **not** eligible for this award. **
