Brian Krohn '08 began his time at Augsburg as a film major but graduated as a chemistry major with minors in biology and math. Through his summer research project, he was a critical part of the team that discovered the Mcgyan process—a cleaner, cheaper method for making biodiesel. While at Augsburg, Brian was the founding editor-in chief of the *Augsburg Honors Review*, the creator of the class The Art, History, and Science of Brewing, and president of the Chemistry Society. He was awarded a Goldwater Scholarship in 2007 and graduated with departmental and College honors in 2008. He was named Augsburg's first ever Rhodes Scholar and began graduate studies at the University of Oxford, England in 2009. While at Oxford he completed a master's degree in environmental change and management, a master's degree in history of science, technology, and medicine with the highest distinction, and spent his spare time involved the rowing, fencing, and entrepreneurial clubs. Brian is now back in Minnesota with his wife Kari Aanestad '08 and will be working as a research fellow at the University of Minnesota studying the environmental impacts of green fuels.
