

Develop a strategy for approaching essay tests.

First, read all the questions, notice the point value for each question.

Budget your time, make sure to answer the questions with the highest point values.

Underline directional words such as **list, contrast,** and **summarize** to be sure your answers are in the required form. Budget 5-10% of your time organizing your ideas before writing.

Write down key words that immediately come to mind. Use the margin or scrap paper to jot down main points.

Finally, write an organized essay, containing an introduction, supporting paragraphs, and a summary. Avoid irrelevant details.

Points regarding style:

- Write legibly. Grading essay questions is, in large part, a subjective process. Sloppy, difficult to read handwriting may actually lower your grade.
- **Be concise**. Avoid filler sentences that say nothing. Write as if you expect the person grading your test to be tired and overworked.
- Use a pen. Much easier to read than a pencil.
- Write on one side of the paper. Writing on the back page will show through and be difficult to read.
