Augsburg University's Public Leadership Scholar Programs give students the opportunity to engage in leadership, service, and learning to make a difference at Augsburg and in the wider community.

You will have the opportunity to participate in a yearlong academic seminar with a cohort of your peers. You will also be able to earn 4 upper division semester credits in the Religion or Political Science and receive a \$2,000 scholarship.
