

living fully as their authentic selves.

Pyotr Ilyich Tchaikovsky (1840-1893) fought against his attractions his whole life, denying his love for his university classmate Sergey Kireyev, entering into a short and disastrous marriage in 1877, and then remaining single for the rest of his life.

Francis Poulenc (1899-1963) was not as intensely closeted as Tchaikovsky, and his romantic relationships with men were known to friends and colleagues. However, he struggled throughout his life to reconcile his sexuality with his Catholicism, saying he was "sincere in faith" but "Parisian in sexuality," as if the two were in conflict.

I play these pieces to honor these composers' struggles and in hope of a day when nobody is denied love and faith and identity are reconciled.
