Music Notes: The prelude and postlude are written by two of the most well-known black composers of classical music from the 20th century. William Grant Still was associated with the Harlem Renaissance and was known as "The Dean of African American Composers." Florence Price is remembered for being the first black woman to have her music performed by a major American orchestra; the Chicago Symphony performed for Symphony No. 1 in E Minor at the World's Fair in 1933.
