

Music Notes: In recognition of Black History Month, preludes and postludes during February will be by African American composers.

John W. Work (1901-1967) is remembered primarily as an educator; he was chair of the music department at Fisk University where he conducted the famous Fisk University Singers, and published seminal research on African American folksongs and spirituals.

Though British by birth and citizenship, Samuel Coleridge Taylor (1875-1912) is often included in lists of African American composers. He achieved worldwide fame in the European classical world with the rather exploitative nickname "The Black Mahler" and frequently toured internationally. He traveled the American South during one of his tours and wrote several works based on the folk music he heard; Bamboula is based on a Haitian dance popular among Creole citizens of New Orleans and the surrounding area.
