Martin Luther King, Jr. Day

This January we mark Martin Luther King, Jr. Day on January 20th. Augsburg's MLK Day of Action & Convocation is entitled, "Where Do We Go From Here: Chaos or Community?" This is the title of Dr. King's 1968 book as well as a speech he gave on August 16, 1967 to Southern Christian Leadership Conference in Atlanta. In both his book and speech, Dr. King calls upon this nation to enact equity for the poor and the neglected, and in particular for the black Americans insisting that nonviolence as the only way—to not give into to hate or violence, but to rise up together naming the truths of the past of white supremacy and racism while working together for economic and racial justice for all.

Throughout the month of January, Campus Ministry will draw upon the MLK Day at Augsburg and the work and witness of Dr. King in Daily Chapel worship. Our general Chapel theme for the month is, "Public Church: Sticking with Love." Together, we will reflect upon this theme
