Augsburg TRIO/SSS participants must be U.S. citizens or permanent residents or refugees pursuing their first bachelor's degree. Participants must be incoming or currently enrolled Augsburg students. Program participants must demonstrate academic need for services and meet at least one of the following criteria: be low-income, a first generation college student, or have a documented disability. Students must also have a commitment to their college success.
