As we hit the mid-way point in the term, there are a few things to keep in mind right now:

- Registration for spring term will open November 19. Registration details are below. If you need further instructions on registration, please e-mail Jolee. If you would like to talk with me about your degree path, please send an e-mail and we will set something up.
- I sent out a note to everyone a couple weeks ago saying that ML 563 is moving to spring term and that we are dropping ML 553 from this year's schedule. 
