To mark this milestone, we encourage you to send a personalized announcement to your local newspaper(s). Using the sample below, create a customized announcement about yourself, including major(s), academic honors, volunteer or internship experiences, study abroad trips, and/or plans for the future. Follow these steps:

- Use your personal details to fill in the blanks, as noted in the bracketed information. Newsrooms are often inundated with announcements, so keep your message short.
- After you add your personal information, mail/email/fax the release to the news desk at your hometown newspaper.
- Graduation announcements are usually directed to a general newsroom email address and not to specific reporters. To avoid having your email deleted or caught in a spam folder, we recommend you find a general email address on the newspaper's website or in the print edition.
- In an email, copy the release directly into the message addressed to your local newspaper(s). Use the subject line: "Local Resident Graduates from Augsburg College."
