



Pediatrics Learning Outcomes

Peds 1: Demonstrate an understanding of the scientific concepts, history taking, physical exam, diagnostic studies, differential diagnosis, clinical intervention and therapeutics, and health maintenance of medical conditions seen in infants, children, and adolescents.

Peds 2: Communicate effectively with patients and other professionals in the pediatric setting.

Peds 3: Perform a history and physical exam, interpretation of diagnostic studies, development of a management plan, patient education, document patient encounter and deliver an oral presentation of common conditions in the pediatric setting.

Peds 4: Select and prescribe antibiotics, using weight-based calculations, for a child with a common acute pediatric complaint.

Peds 5: Demonstrate respect, compassion and empathy to patients and colleagues, displaying sensitivity to an individual's unique background.

Peds 6: Demonstrate the ability to make informed decisions about diagnostic and therapeutic interventions using patient information, scientific evidence and clinical judgment.

Peds 7: Determine and communicate appropriate referral resources for an adolescent patient presenting with behavioral or social concerns.

Peds 8: Discuss the vaccine status (preventive) of a child considering the families individual background, and apply it to the context of the patient visit.

Peds 9: Perform and document a preventive well visit for a child, including the use of a growth chart and a developmental assessment.

Peds 10: Perform and document a preventive well visit for an infant, including the use of a growth chart and a developmental assessment.
