Good morning. Over the weekend we hosted the winter meeting of the Augsburg Board of Regents, meeting for the first time in the Kennedy Center. What a wonderful new space for our college community. Assistant dean and wrestling coach Jeff Swenson offered the regents a great tour of the new facility. Very impressive!

BOARD OF REGENTS MEETING

Four initiatives were the primary discussions items for the Board of Regents meetings:

- Recommendations for tuition/room and board fees for 2007-08—News of the final recommendations will be shared in the next couple of weeks.
- Capital improvements—At the beginning of 2006, following a facilities audit, the Board of Regents committed to allocate \$900,000 over three years in addition to annual operating funds to complete a schedule of the highest priority capital needs.
- For 2006-07, a new roof for Memorial Hall, the installation of the new field dome, and the repair of the Urness balcony have been completed. Over the spring and summer 2007, the Christensen Center elevator will be replaced.
- During summer 2007, the FY '08 projects will include roof work on Urness, Mortensen, Melby, and Christensen; the elevators in Urness will be upgraded; and the Melby fire alarm system will also be upgraded.
- Summer 2008 projects, for FY '09, include new roofs on Murphy, Music, and Christensen; elevator modernization in Mortensen; and mechanical work in Melby and the Ice Arena.
- Five-year enrollment plan—the board also discussed an initial draft of a Five-Year Enrollment Plan for the College, which was prepared and presented by Julie Olson, vice president for enrollment management. The enrollment plan will be the focus of many community conversations in the next few months.
- Dashboard of Indicators—The board considered the draft of an Institutional Dashboard that includes various indicators to track our well-being as we move forward. Examples of the indicators include student retention and graduation rates, alumni giving, student-faculty ratios, and many others. Another important aspect of the dashboard is defining a new peer group of colleges and universities similar to us in make-up of student populations, urban location, financial model, etc., with whom we can compare ourselves more accurately. We appreciate the assistance of several faculty and staff members in determining this new peer comparison group.

They will affirm the accuracy of the College's Systems Portfolio, review organizational actions and processes that demonstrate Augsburg's commitment to quality initiatives, and conduct a federal compliance review.
