Good morning. I hope you all enjoyed the snowy weekend!

This is a busy time of year for high school seniors, as they begin making their decisions and choices about college—and for our day admissions and enrollment staff, who have been busy preparing for admission and financial aid. Friday and Saturday we will host our annual Scholarship Weekend, which will bring over 200 talented students to campus to compete for President's Scholarships and Performing Arts Scholarships.

This year, an overnight component has been added with activities Friday evening to engage prospective students and help them better experience life at Augsburg. Honors Program students will host the President's Scholarship applicants, and nearly 40 faculty members will assist in conducting interviews. The Parent and Family Relations Office will offer hospitality and sessions for parents coming with their students.

Day admissions and Enrollment Center staff have also been actively involved with several organizations that help students develop college readiness and help us increase our diversity and expand higher education access. With one of these programs, Admission Possible, Augsburg has hosted four visits to campus, bringing a total of 489 students. This has been done as part of the new A-CAP (Augsburg College Access Program) that offers scholarships to students who participate in readiness programs, with top students able to qualify for full tuition.

I am very pleased that this year by the Dec. 15 Early Advantage admission deadline, Augsburg had received more than 1000 applications, up 26% over the same time in previous years. More than 30% of these applications are from students of color.

And ... in sports notes ... don't forget to cheer on our Auggie wrestlers as they compete for their 10th national title on Friday and Saturday in Dubuque, Iowa. While ranked no. 2, the team has qualified wrestlers in all 10 weight classes for the championship. Updates will be posted after each session at http://www.augsburg.edu/athletics.

Budget process for 2007-08
