On Thursday, I joined the Augsburg staff to recognize those who have reached milestones in service of 5, 10, 15, and 25 years. I also had the honor of recognizing two staff members—Mary Jastremski in the Undergraduate Admissions Office, and Sharon Rauenhorst, in Administrative Accounting—as Staff Employees of the Year. Congratulations to both of them for their dedication and service, as recognized and lifted up by their colleagues.

Congratulations to sophomore Nou Chang, who has been named a recipient of a Jay and Rose Phillips Foundation Scholarship for 2007-09. She is one of six students at Minnesota private colleges to receive a Phillips Foundation scholarship that supports potential leaders who have outstanding academic credentials and who intend to dedicate a portion of their lives to community service. Her project includes activities and programs for homeless Hmong refugee children at Mary's Place in north Minneapolis.
