Good morning. What a grand weekend we've just enjoyed! Our Friday night celebration of abundance and generosity as we dedicated the new Kennedy Center and honored the individuals and families who made it possible was a great beginning.

On Saturday, we graduated 31 students in the Physician Assistant master's program and 409 students in the day program, and we began a new tradition as academic departments hosted receptions for their graduates and families.
