Survey recommends choices for the eatery

In a recent survey, over 400 respondents, more than half of them students, expressed a desire for healthy foods and socially responsible choices for the Oren Gateway Center's new eatery.

The survey report, compiled by Lars Christiansen in the sociology department, lists the responses on types of food, the costs respondents were willing to pay, and the hours the eatery should be open. Some respondents suggested that the eatery is an opportunity for Augsburg to make a statement in the community about what the College values. The

Summer events on campus

Campus facilities remain busy all summer, with College-scheduled activities as well as outside groups renting space. Here's a sampling of what's going on this summer—please welcome Augsburg visitors as you meet them!

- Minnesota Private College Week—High school students and parents visit colleges, with information sessions at 9:30 a.m. and 2 p.m. each day. June 25-29. Additional visits days for day admissions at Augsburg are on July 27 for Summer in the City and on Aug. 7 for Back to School Special Event
- Summer Bridge—a five-week residential program for 25 admitted first-year Augsburg students who are TRIO/SSS eligible. Students take two courses, attend academic support seminars, workshops, and enjoy other social and cultural activities. July 8–Aug. 9.
- SOAR—Incoming first-year students attend an overnight orientation, with their parents, that includes information on academics, community values, building social relationships and activities, etc., to ease the transition into college. Choice of sessions on July 18-19, 19-20, or 20-21.
- GEMS/GISE program (Girls in Engineering, Mathematics, and Science) and GISE (Guys in Science and Engineering)—Middle- and high-school girls and boys from Minneapolis Public Schools on campus, with nine Augsburg student mentors working with them. June 18–Aug. 16.
- Advanced Placement teacher workshops—Two sessions will bring around 300 teachers from the U.S. and other countries who teach or are preparing to teach advanced placement courses. June 25-29 and July 23-27.
- Sports camps—A number of sports camps are offered by Augsburg athletics:
 - Wrestling June 10-14, Technique Camp June 15-17, Father-Son Camp (elementary/junior high) June 17-21, Team Camp
 - Men's Soccer
 - June 18-21, ages 9-14
