Good morning. With yesterday's Commencement celebration we have now completed Augsburg's 138th academic year—and my first year—here at Augsburg. In this ceremony that focused on our adult student populations, we graduated 219 baccalaureate students in Weekend College, Rochester, and the United/Mercy/Unity hospitals programs, plus 286 master's students in leadership, education, nursing, business administration, and social work.

The inaugural Richard J. Thoni award, created upon his retirement to recognize longtime service to Augsburg and students, was given to social work major Angela Brand for exemplifying a passion and commitment to public service. Among her many accolades, she received recognition for completing 240 hours of public service at Chisago County Social Services, working with programs to help youth transition to adults.

We also welcomed Dr. Martin Marty to the Augsburg alumni community as we awarded him an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters, *honoris causa*. In his Commencement address, "Learning How to Live—Realistically, Life Long," he encouraged students to learn to ask questions so that they can experience life as a process, not a product, and begin to understand their own irreplaceable "thing that has their own special stamp," that is their vocation, as differing from career or profession.

President's Climate Commitment

I have joined, on behalf of Augsburg, the American College and University President's Climate Commitment. This initiative, modeled after the U.S. Mayors Climate Protection Agreement, is sponsored by Second Nature, ecoAmerica, and the Association of the Advancement of Sustainability in Higher Education (AASHE). To date, more than 300 colleges and universities have signed on and agreed to reduce and ultimately neutralize greenhouse gas emissions on campus. The commitment includes developing a plan to achieve climate neutrality, initiating actions to reduce greenhouse gases, and measuring and reporting periodic progress. For three consecutive summers, the 23 students learn about the medical profession, shadow physicians, and prepare for medical school exams and interviews.
