Rick Thoni plans retirement

I want to share with you the news that Rick Thoni, director of our Rochester Program, will retire from full-time service to Augsburg on January 12, 2007, in order to pursue community service in the greater Rochester area. Rick will continue to serve Augsburg part time as an academic adviser for the Rochester Program through the end of the current academic year.

Over the past few months I've enjoyed the opportunity to get to know Rick and appreciate what he has contributed to Augsburg. I know that those of you who have worked with him during his 34 years here can speak more eloquently to his vision, commitment, and leadership in helping Augsburg shape its mission and institutional vocation. He is looking forward to sharing these same talents with community initiatives in the Rochester area.

In the early 1980s, it was Rick's understanding of the demographic trends forecasting a significant decline in the number of high school students that led him to propose and develop an undergraduate program for working adults. Weekend College began in 1982 with 69 students and three majors—and next year will celebrate its 25th anniversary, enrolling more than 1,000 students.

Likewise, when it became clear that there was a demand for undergraduate education in Rochester, Rick's vision for a program that partnered with the community in the fields of nursing and business has grown to a branch campus currently enrolling 374 students in both undergraduate and graduate programs.

Rick was also instrumental in the creation of Augsburg's Master of Arts in Leadership program—soon to celebrate 20 years—designed to build leadership skills across disciplines.

Since 1972, Rick's great gift to the College has been a deep commitment to an education that makes a qualitative difference—a transforming difference—in the lives of students. I'm sure that many of our adult students would attribute much of their academic success to Rick's mentoring and friendship.
