You've probably noticed our new air structure that went up during the week, but you many not realize what a busy place it is all winter. New staff sabbatical program

I am very pleased to announce that the President's Cabinet has approved a staff sabbatical program, allowing staff to apply for up to three months of focused work and/or research away from campus, with continuing salary and benefits. Staff must have worked at Augsburg for seven years continuously at least three-quarters time to qualify and must

submit a proposal to their supervisors for review. Final approval is granted by the President's Cabinet. The staff person must return to Augsburg and work at least one year following the sabbatical. You will hear more about this program from Human Resources—I encourage staff to take advantage of this new program.
