Good morning. I've just returned from Phoenix (a good decision on the coldest weekend of the year!), where **several members of the Augsburg faculty and I attended the annual meeting of the Western Mission Network of the Evangelical Lutheran Church in America (ELCA).** The meeting involves ELCA-related organizations in the western half of the U.S. whose missions include theological education. We were joined by representatives of seven other ELCA colleges, Luther and Pacific Lutheran seminaries, various synodical education programs, and related organizations for two days of consultations on ways we can strengthen our partnerships around theological education for the church. I continue to be impressed by our church's deep commitment to education.

On Friday and Saturday, **our Board of Regents comes together for its winter meeting**. **The board's primary strategic discussion will provide them an opportunity to explore the vision for Augsburg's new signature academic building, the Center for Science, Business, and Religion**, which will house natural sciences, psychology, mathematics, religion and business departments, as well as interdisciplinary programs that help prepare students as effective citizens. We will be joined by architects from Holabird & Root who will provide a preview of plans for the new building.

A second board initiative for this winter meeting includes new opportunities for board members to meet and spend time with students. At Friday's luncheon, students will enjoy "Table Talk" with the regents; later on Friday regents will have a chance to meet and talk with student-athletes at dinner prior to attending either the wrestling match against Wartburg College or the men's hockey game against St. John's University.
