Good morning. Happy President's Day! Today I write from the 95th annual meeting of the Lutheran college presidents and spouses, where I always enjoy being with colleagues from around the country. It serves as another reminder of the strong links we have to our sister institutions and the proud tradition of Lutheran higher education of which we are a part.

This week also brings reminders of how our common work together is always focused on students, whether by reaching into the community to connect and engage students, by helping prospective students decide if Augsburg is the best place for them, or by offering our current students everything we can to prepare them for responsible global citizenship.

On Tuesday and Wednesday, Music Department chair **Bob Stacke and Augsburg's jazz ensemble will participate in WITNESS, an annual program sponsored by VocalEssence, that partners with nearly 50 area schools** to present music from the African-American tradition. This year, WITNESS explores the work and influence of Duke Ellington in two concerts that bring school kids to the Ordway Center for Performing Arts.

Bob Stacke is directing a High School All Star Jazz Band, which will be joined by the Augsburg Jazz Ensemble. It's a wonderful example of community partnership, with Minneapolis high school band members gaining great experience and Augsburg jazz students serving as mentors. A community concert at Hopkins High School Sunday afternoon, Feb. 24, at 4 p.m. will repeat the Ordway program, organized like an old-time radio show. Both Randall Davidson (fine arts manager) and I serve on the VocalEssence board, and we are excited about programs and partnerships like this that engage youth in the community.

Next weekend, Friday evening and Saturday, Augsburg hosts Scholarship Weekend, when prospective students come to campus to interview for honor scholarships and audition for fine arts scholarships. This year 120 students are competing for President's Scholarships—an Augsburg record number!—and 76 students for the Fine Arts Scholarships (which includes 27 students vying for both). I hope you will welcome these future Auggies and their parents and help them learn about our campus.

For the third year, the financial aid office is sponsoring "dollar/sense," a series of eight sessions to educate students about financial literacy and encourage responsible money choices. I encourage students to take advantage of these informal, fun sessions Monday-Thursday evenings at 6:30 p.m., this week and next week. President's Higher Education Honor Roll for Community Service

For the second year in a row, **Augsburg was named to the President's Higher Education Community Service Honor Roll with Distinction.** This Honor Roll recognizes institutions of higher education that support innovative, effective, and exemplary community service programs. It considers the scope and innovation of service projects, the percentage of student who participate, and the extent to which service-learning courses are offered.

Of the 528 colleges named, Augsburg was among 127 that were specially honored "with distinction." In addition, nine colleges received special awards for extraordinary service and special achievement.

The Honor Roll is sponsored jointly by the Corporation for National and Community Service, the Department of Education, the Department of Housing and Urban Development, USA Freedom Corps, Campus Compact, and the President's Council on Service and Civic Participation.
