Today we welcome to Augsburg Dr. Michail Ioffe, rector, and Dr. Larissa Kartashova, deputy rector, of the Sinerghia Finance and Economic Institute, in Moscow. During this week on campus they are meeting with Augsburg faculty and administration to explore opportunities for cooperation between the two institutions regarding faculty exchanges and an Augsburg MBA initiative in Moscow.

Augsburg's Urban Debate Program Expands

The Minnesota Urban Debate League (MNUDL), an Augsburg program housed within the Communication Studies Department and led by Professor Bob Groven, has added new schools and sponsors, and now attracts annual grants and donations totaling around \$100,000 per year to the College. The MNUDL sponsors six high school programs and three junior high school debate programs in Minneapolis and St. Paul, and serves several hundred students, teachers, and coaches. The MNUDL is an important partner in Augsburg's work in the city.

Debaters from several Urban Debate League schools have enjoyed recent success in regional and national tournaments. Top debaters from St. Paul Central qualified for a national debate tournament. Minneapolis South's top MNUDL debaters advanced to the semifinal round at a tournament in Atlanta that attracted teams from 14 cities across the country.
