Good morning. As spring semester students complete their exams this week, we are preparing for Commencement on Saturday, the first of our two Commencement ceremonies. The theme wrapping both commencements this year is global citizenship, as the Center for Global Education completes its year-long, 25th-anniversary celebration.

At this ceremony, we will celebrate with 366 Day College students and 26 physician assistant master's degree students who are eligible to receive their degrees. Eleven international students from nine countries are included, and six International Partners students who are graduating in Norway will participate in our ceremony as well. We will also honor this year's winner of the Marina Christensen Justice award, a student who has demonstrated exceptional interest and commitment in reaching out to disadvantaged people in our community.

Professor Jack Weatherford, from Macalester College, will present the Commencement address on Saturday, as well as receive an honorary degree. Several of us enjoyed his keynote speech last year at the NAFSA international educators' conference—he is a both a cultural anthropologist and a gifted storyteller—and I look forward to welcoming him to Augsburg.

The second Commencement ceremony, on Sunday, June 29, will graduate students in Weekend College, Rochester, the Partner Hospital programs, and the five master's programs of education, leadership, nursing, business administration, and social work. At that ceremony the speaker will be ELCA presiding bishop and Augsburg alumnus and parent Mark Hanson '68. Honorary degrees will be conferred upon Bishop Medardo Gomez, from El Salvador, and Ambassador Koryne Horbal.
