CAMPUS PROJECTS AND INITIATIVES

Augsburg Board of Regents spring meeting

At their spring meeting on Friday, the Augsburg Board of Regents pursued a full agenda. Among the highlights of the meeting were:

- Report on an updated campus master plan, to be completed in early fall 2008;
- Review and approval of the College's operating budget for 2008-09;
- Election of new officers for the board, including Mike Good '71 as the new chairman; Dean Kopperud as vice-chairman; Dan Anderson '65 as treasurer; and Jodi Harpstead as secretary. The board also said good-bye to regents Gary Benson, Ron Nelson, and Ted Grindal, whose terms ended after 12 years of distinguished service.
- Presentation of plans for the new Center for Science, Business, and Religion; and,
- Presentation of campaign plans to help fund the new center and other important college priorities.

I am extremely grateful to the Augsburg regents for their engagement and commitment to the well-being of our college. It is a pleasure to serve with them on Augsburg's behalf.
