Augsburg Fund reaches million dollar goal

I am pleased to share some great news about our fundraising in 2007-08. The Augsburg Fund reached its fiscal year goal of \$1,000,000. More than 2,700 donors made gifts to the Augsburg Fund totaling \$1,000,978.91, including 100% participation by members of the Board of Regents and the Alumni Board of Directors.

Annual gifts to the Augsburg Fund allow the College to improve facilities and purchase needed equipment, recruit faculty, maintain essential extracurricular and athletic programs, and enhance teaching and learning across the campus. Most importantly, gifts to this fund provide the scholarships that make an Augsburg education affordable for students in need.

Donors to the Augsburg Fund include the Board of Regents, alumni, faculty, parents, friends, staff, the senior class, as well as corporations through outright and matching gifts.

German students visit Augsburg

From May 28–June 6, the Business-MIS Department hosted 14 undergraduate business students and two faculty members from Karlsruhe Berufsakademie, University of Cooperative Education, in Karlsruhe, Germany. Lori Peterson, Augsburg for Adults, and Steven Zitnick, MBA program, led the students in an intensive classroom experience focused on international management. Subsequently, Karlsruhe Berufsakademie professors Bernd Dannenmayer and Thomas Freytag taught a computer-based business simulation. The group also visited Twin Cities' businesses and corporations.

On June 4, Ruediger Schaefer, dean of Karlsruhe Berufsakademie, met with Magda Paleczny-Zapp, chair of the Business-MIS Department; Orval Gingerich, director of the Center for Global Education; and Dean Barbara Farley to extend the relationship beyond student exchanges. A letter of intent outlining these efforts is under review and development.

In 2006, professors Stuart Stoller and Kathy Schwalbe accompanied a group of Augsburg students to Karlsruhe and hosted a group of German students at Augsburg.

National Science Foundation has awarded Augsburg \$1.04 million for continued study of Earth's space environment during the next five years using the Magnetometer Array for Cusp and Cleft Studies (MACCS) in Arctic Canada. The new NSF grant will support research work by three Augsburg physics faculty: **Mark Engebretson**, frequent visiting scientist **Slava Pilipenko** (also at Moscow's Space Research Institute and Institute of the Physics of the Earth), and **David Murr '92**, who will join Augsburg's faculty in September. Funds will also support assistant scientist **Jennifer Posch '94**, Computer Science faculty **Erik Steinmetz '86**, and several **undergraduate students**.
