Good morning. What a whirlwind first week of school we have all enjoyed, as **we welcomed new first-year and transfer students, new faculty and staff, and welcomed back returning students.** I was especially struck during the past week of the various ways in which we live out three closely related parts of our mission: we are a teaching and learning community, which was illustrated in our opening convocations and in the beginning of classes; we are centered in faith and worship, which was obvious in our return to the gift of daily chapel gatherings; and we are sent out to serve our neighbors, which was powerfully visible in our City Service projects, during which we served 22 agencies in the city. Thanks to all of you for living our mission each and every day.

In this first update of the fall, **I want to focus on three broad, strategic goals for the 2007-08 year** that I have set as a framework for our work together this year. Each of these goals helps to set a context for various projects and initiatives that continue to shape our institutional work and culture.

Goal 1: To govern together, the various ways in which governance of the College is understood, supported, and practiced as shared. What does it mean to share power, to participate in decision-making, and to be accountable for how our work advances the Augsburg mission?

Goal 2: To plan intentionally, the various ways in which strategic, tactical, and operational plans are grounded in mission and vision. How do we create a “planning culture,” a community in which all plans help us live out our highest aspirations?

Goal 3: To transform our philanthropic culture, the various ways in which focusing on the College’s sesquicentennial in 2019 creates a constructive horizon for philanthropic activity. How do we build relationships, tell the Augsburg story, and raise the funds needed to sustain Augsburg’s mission—now and into the future?

There will be opportunities to talk more about these goals and to be involved in the important work that will help us to achieve them. I look forward to our work together this year.

AQIP Reaffirmation of Accreditation

Six years ago, we joined AQIP—the **Academic Quality Improvement Program**—and we began a process through the Higher Learning Commission of the North Central Association (our accrediting body) that led to the **submission of our application for Reaffirmation of Accreditation on August 31.** This is the final component of the seven-year AQIP cycle, and the most important, because it is a summative review that will affirm our continuing status as a regionally accredited institution. Our application follows a highly successful Quality Checkup Site Visit that was held last February.

One of the best things about the AQIP model is that institutions use their own improvement initiatives to accomplish levels of performance that meet the Commission's Criteria for Accreditation. **I encourage you to read the updated Systems Portfolio** and other documents that were submitted to the AQIP Reaffirmation Panel at <http://www.augsburg.edu/aqip/>. These reports tell a compelling story about the important work that is happening across this College to keep the Augsburg promise of providing great educational experiences to all students.

My special thanks to Dean Farley for leading us in the AQIP process, and to Bridget Robinson-Riegler, and the AQIP Steering Committee for their work in preparing our application for Reaffirmation of Accreditation. We look forward to receiving positive news about our continuing accreditation later this fall
