Good morning. On Saturday, **I leave for a brief, week-long trip to China** sponsored by the Minnesota Private College Council, in conjunction with the new partnership between our private colleges and the United International College (UIC) in Zhuhai, China. While there, I will present a lecture entitled "A Civic Education: Wisdom and Citizenship" as part of the first annual UIC Presidential Lecture Series on the Liberal Arts. United International College is also a partnership, between Beijing Normal University and the Hong Kong Baptist University, and is the first fully-sanctioned liberal arts college to be created in China in more than 50 years. The UIC-MPCC partnership offers great opportunities for student, staff, and faculty exchanges, and gives us a unique experience in learning about China from the perspectives of the liberal arts. When I return, I look forward to sharing with you what I learned during the week there.

Already, we have enjoyed exchanges and visits with UIC over the past few months. In September Tom Morgan (special assistant to the president) and Diane Pike (sociology) traveled there to lead several workshops on leadership, and on teaching and learning. In July we hosted a group of 25 Chinese students from UIC who spent four days on our campus (plus five other MPCC campuses) to experience American culture
