Good morning. I am just back from my trip to visit the United International College (UIC) in Zhuhai, China. There is much to report about the promise of our partnership with UIC, the first liberal arts college to be established in China in more than 50 years, and I look forward to sharing some reflections about UIC in the near future. For now, please know that our colleagues in China are extremely excited to continue to strengthen our mutual efforts to pursue a liberal arts-oriented education, preparing our students for lives of leadership and service to the world.

With less than a month passed since we mourned the death of Augsburg legend Joel Torstenson, I am again deeply saddened to share with you the news of Leland Sateren's death on Saturday at age 94. Dr. Sateren graduated from Augsburg in 1935 and returned in 1946 to begin teaching, composing, and conducting for 33 years. During the nearly 30 years that he directed the Augsburg Choir, Augsburg's choral music program became renowned, as the choir developed a more contemporary sound and expanded its reach outside of churches into community venues, and beyond the Midwest into Europe and other international locations. That remarkable legacy continues today in our proud tradition of excellence in our choral programs, as well as our entire music department. He has been retired since 1979. A memorial service for Dr. Sateren will be held here on campus next Saturday morning. Please watch for further details.

On this Veterans' Day commemoration, I encourage you to pause to think about the members of our Augsburg community who are currently serving in the military or who have returned from duty. Please keep their families and all who are impacted by having loved ones in the service in your thoughts and prayers.

On Wednesday we host Jane Fonda and expect a large crowd in Melby Hall for her Koryne Horbal lecture. It has been interesting over the past few weeks to introduce our students to her work on stage and screen at the several showings we have hosted at Augsburg House.
