Good morning. As 2007 comes to an end today, I hope you have enjoyed a joyful Christmas holiday with family and friends. I look forward to the beginning of the new year and all that it may bring as we continue our work together.

Even though students are away from the College and many faculty and staff have been enjoying vacation time, the campus and our campus community remain busy during these holiday weeks. Construction continues in Christensen Center to renovate the old bookstore area into a flexible student activity area. The scheduled completion is January 18, with furniture arriving a month or so after that.

I also want to highlight several other capital renewal projects that have recently been completed:

- Urness Hall elevators—both elevators have been completely renovated with addition of updated electronic controls for more reliable elevator service for residents.
- Christensen dock and south entry—the dock area has been expanded, automatic doors
 were installed to control heating and cooling loss, and the south accessible entrance has
 been upgraded.
- Mortensen Hall south entry—the ADA entrance and access mechanism is now upgraded.

This week three short-term study groups leave for visits abroad of 8-10 days—Bob Stacke leads a group to study Caribbean music in Jamaica, Michael Lansing takes a group to Nicaragua to learn about women's grassroots movements, and Bev Stratton travels with students to El Salvador to explore the Christian faith and vocation of the Salvadoran people. We wish them safe journeys and look forward to hearing about their experiences when they return.

The Auggie women's hockey team travels to Germany, Austria, and Italy from January 3-12, led by head coach Jill Pohtilla, assistant coach Tom Peart, and head athletic trainer Missy Strauch. They'll play local club teams in the Munich area, and then travel to Italy, with a sightseeing stop in Innsbruck, Austria. We wish them luck in their competition and enjoyment during their European travel.

Activities during the Christmas break also keep our air structure a busy place. The schedule for these two weeks includes baseball clinics, a youth soccer camp, football camp, and high school lacrosse.
