**Good morning.** Final exams begin today for day students who are completing their spring semester. **On Saturday we celebrate the first of our two Commencements**—this year's theme for both Commencements is science, and three distinguished scientists will participate in the ceremonies.

On Saturday, 407 day students and 23 physician assistant master's degree students are eligible to graduate, including 17 international students from 11 countries.

Kerry A. Emanuel, professor of atmospheric science and director of the Program in Atmospheres, Oceans, and Climate at Massachusetts Institute of Technology, will present the Commencement address, "Science and Beyond." He is known for his research on hurricane physics as well as for his interest in educating the public about science and scientific inquiry. Professor Emanuel will also receive an honorary Doctor of Science degree.

The Commencement on Sunday, June 28, will graduate students in Weekend College, Rochester, the Partner Hospital programs, and the five master's programs of education, leadership, nursing, business administration, and social work. At that ceremony, the speaker will be Eric Jolly, president of the Science Museum of Minnesota and an Augsburg regent. Jane Lubchenco, under secretary of commerce for oceans and atmosphere, and administrator of the National Oceanic and Atmospheric Administration (NOAA), will receive an honorary degree. She is the first woman and the first marine biologist to lead NOAA.

I am sad to report the death of Lilly Gracia Christensen, widow of Bernhard Christensen, Augsburg's fifth president, and professor emerita of English. She passed away last Tuesday at the age of 97. In her role as wife of a college president and Lutheran church leader, Mrs. Christensen hosted a wide range of guests, including the King of Norway. She taught for 16 years in the English Department where she mentored many students who fondly remember her wise counsel and compassionate concern. She was a 50-year member of Trinity Lutheran Congregation. Our thoughts and prayers are with her family during this difficult time. We will join the family in a memorial service in Hoversten Chapel on Sunday, June 21, at 3 p.m.

Next Monday's Update will be the last weekly update for this academic year. Through spring trimester and our June Commencement, we'll issue Updates every two weeks—on May 4, May 18, June 1, June 15, and June 29. Over the summer, there will be an Update in mid-July and one in mid-August.
