Good morning. This week, two 10-week undergraduate summer research programs get underway for students in the McNair Program and for the research students funded through the Office of Undergraduate Research and Graduate Opportunity (URGO).

The McNair Scholars, students from groups that are underrepresented in graduate studies, receive support and encouragement to attend graduate school. Their summer research is the major component of the federally-funded McNair program; students carry out original research with a faculty mentor, and have opportunities later to publish and present their work at professional conferences.

This summer's McNair Scholars are studying varied topics—from poetry to kidney stones, from children's humor to over-the-counter medicines, and from surface potential to success. Read more at http://augnet.augsburg.edu/news-archives/2009/05_18_09/mcnair_researchers.html

URGO undergraduate student researchers will work with faculty mentors in 15 different disciplines. They meet weekly at a Research Roundtable to hear about each other's projects across disciplines, and to learn about literature reviews, making presentations, graduate school, national fellowships, etc. A final paper and an oral presentation are required.
