Good morning. If there's a lull on campus during the summer, we're in it for the moment. Summer session classes ended last week, and, beginning on Saturday, we welcome back student athletes and other groups returning to prepare for fall activities—see the list in Notable Events below.

Orientation for new faculty and staff takes place on September 1 and 2, and the campus community will have opportunities to meet and welcome them at that time.

Saturday, September 5, signals the official return to fall activities as first-year day students move into the residence halls. A week of events during Auggie Days will keep them busy, as their Augsburg Seminar (AugSem) begins to orient them to college life and activities on and off campus. We also host the first Auggie football game of the year that evening against non-conference foe Crown College.

Opening Convocation, featuring an address by Professor Tracy Bibelnieks, is scheduled for Tuesday, September 8, followed by our annual City Service Day in the community.

Fall semester classes begin on Wednesday, September 9, and fall trimester undergraduate adult classes and most graduate classes begin on Friday, September 11.

In the meantime, many of us on staff and faculty look forward to welcoming alumni, students, families, and friends at the Augsburg booth in the Education Building at the Minnesota State Fair, August 27–September 7. I hope to see you there!

CAMPUS PROJECTS AND INITIATIVES

Yellow Ribbon Program

I am pleased to report that Augsburg has joined the Yellow Ribbon Program, part of the new Post-9/11 G.I. Bill, which offers recent active-duty military veterans wider options for college study than ever before, including at private colleges. The requirements for benefits include 36 months of active duty service after September 11, 2001, or a discharge with a disability after serving at least 30 days.

With matches from the U.S. government, the Department of Veterans Affairs, and Augsburg's military discount, it means that a weekend undergraduate student can attend Augsburg for \$33 per course, or a full year for under \$200. Cost for the traditional day program and graduate programs will be somewhat higher, due to higher tuition costs in those programs. Post-9/11 veterans will pay approximately \$250 per course, for example, in the MBA program.

Use the "Submit Calendar Item" link in AugNet Services, (on the left-hand side of the page) under Community. These submissions go to the Marketing and Communication Office and are then posted. It's important to remember also to submit any subsequent changes to update the calendar.

The Calendar includes events that are open to the public as well as internal events, i.e., those just for campus groups or committees. (The information for these events is marked "internal" and is visible only after log-in to Inside Augsburg.)
