Good morning. On Friday we host the annual meeting of the Augsburg Corporation Governing Board, which has usually been held during fall break when many students are away from campus. The Governing Board represents the ELCA's constitutional support to the College from Augsburg's four designated synods— Minneapolis, Saint Paul, Southeastern Minnesota, and the Northwest Synod of Wisconsin. The board includes representatives from the congregations in these synods, and Augsburg 's Board of Regents, faculty, college administrators, and students.

The Governing Board members will join us at chapel on Friday. Professor Hans Wiersma will speak and the Music Department will provide special music. The board will also have the chance to meet several of our student researchers during community time as they exhibit posters and answer questions about their research. I hope to see you at chapel to help welcome our guests.

On behalf of the Augsburg community, **I want to offer congratulations to Trinity Lutheran Congregation as it celebrates its 140th anniversary on Sunday**. Augsburg and Trinity have been close partners for nearly that long; it was Trinity that largely was responsible for Augsburg's relocation in 1872 from Marshall, Wis., to Minneapolis. In 1871, Rev. Ole Paulson at Trinity led a committee and successfully secured funds, land, and materials that would initially build Augsburg's campus in Cedar-Riverside. For many years, until Trinity's church building was lost to freeway construction, Augsburg events and ceremonies took place there. Now, for a number of years, Augsburg has hosted Trinity's worship home in Hoversten Chapel.

On Sunday, Trinity will celebrate at their 11 a.m. worship service, with Bishop Craig Johnson. At noon, following the service, there will be a silent auction to benefit the youth and outreach program, and Augsburg will host a lunch reception. All are welcome!
