#### Brian Krohn is Augsburg's first Rhodes Scholar

On behalf of the entire Augsburg community, I am so proud to extend congratulations to chemistry major and Honors Program senior **Brian Krohn**, who was selected this weekend as a Rhodes Scholar for 2009. He is Augsburg's first Rhodes Scholar and will enter Oxford University next fall to study environmental change and management.

Brian has distinguished himself at Augsburg in many activities, but is best known for his summer research with chemistry professor Arlin Gyberg that led to collaboration with Augsburg alumnus Clayton McNeff at SarTec Corporation and the discovery of the Mcgyan process to make biodiesel fuel.

Brian is one of 31 Rhodes Scholars selected for 2009, from 769 applications submitted. Rhodes Scholarships, created in 1902, are the oldest of the international study awards available to American students and provide two or three years of study.

**Turkeypalooza is underway** again this year, with Campus Kitchen planning to serve 700 Thanksgiving meals. Last Thursday, they participated in the Multicultural Dinner at Brian Coyle Center, and this week they'll deliver turkey dinners on Wednesday to their regular diners and meal sites.

For more than 25 years at Augsburg, Diane has been recognized for her excellence as a classroom teacher and as a role model for other faculty members, in large part due to her ongoing participation in workshops and summer institutes, and her avid attention to the professional literature on student learning.

Her accomplishments at Augsburg have included re-envisioning the work of the Committee on Faculty Development, integrating activities for faculty and professional staff members, and creating dedicated space for student learning and CTL in Lindell Library. Most notably, however, has been her leadership in the creation of the new AugCore general education program—guiding the design team work and faculty collaboratives on specific issues, as well as securing a Bush Foundation grant for implementation.

Diane continues to serve in leadership roles to share her expertise in teaching portfolios and student engagement with others. She is a frequent contributor at regional and national meetings and institutes, and is a leader in the Midwest Sociological Association. Congratulations, Diane, for this honor.

#### Winter sports are underway

The winter sports teams—men's and women's hockey, men's and women's basketball, and wrestling—have begun their competition already. Both hockey teams are encouraged by young teams returning to build on last year's experience. The Auggie wrestlers enter the season with new head coach Mark Matzek '05 and ranked No. 2 in NCAA Division III.
