Good morning. As you read this, Abigail and I are in Norway to attend the Nobel Peace Prize ceremony, visit several universities, and meet with Augsburg alumni there. I also look forward to visiting the Royal Palace at the end of the week where I will have an audience with His Majesty King Harald V, who visited Augsburg in 1995.

I am pleased to report to you on the first meeting of the Financial Futures Commission. As you recall, this is one of the three commissions I've established to study various strategic issues facing the College, this one especially important as we continue to closely monitor the effects on the College of the nation's economic crisis.

The Financial Futures Commission is made up of members of the College community, including faculty, staff, students, and regents. Its charge is to optimize Augsburg College's financial portfolio so that we can realize our intended teaching and learning outcomes. The commission will continue to meet monthly through the rest of the academic year and make recommendations about financial plans to the Board of Regents at its May 2009 meeting.

At their initial meeting, the commission reviewed a primer on the basics of the College's finances, and looked at the five strategic drivers for a viable financial future—moving to long-term financial planning in addition to annual budget planning; strategically managing current and future debt; continuing to diversify the revenue sources of the College; increasing fundraising and investment returns; and monitoring College costs, while linking them to the strategy and vision of the College.

At the same time we are studying our financial practices and policies, we continue to expand our offerings to make education more accessible, especially to non-traditional students. In January the MBA program will launch a cohort at a new location, St. Stephen Lutheran Church in Bloomington. Preparation is underway, as technology is being installed to provide connections to curriculum, services, and information on campus. We are excited to launch Augsburg in Bloomington and to partner with our friends at St. Stephen.
