Good morning. Classes at Augsburg do not meet today, as we pause to celebrate the life and work of Martin Luther King Jr. This year's convocation features the distinguished civil rights leader and professor Charles McDew, along with special music and tributes to Dr. King. I hope you'll join me and many of our neighbors as we gather for this 22nd annual event that is a call to action for reconciliation and social justice in the world.

The Augsburg community joins with our fellow citizens around the world as we pray for and reach out to help those who are suffering in the aftermath of the horrific earthquake in Haiti. We especially remember the family and friends of Ben Larson, a Luther College graduate and Wartburg Seminary student, who died as a result of the earthquake. Ben and his wife, Renee (a Concordia College graduate), are connected to many of us, and Ben's death is a jarring reminder of how a tragedy far away can hit so close to home. We will hold all of the victims of the Haiti earthquake in our prayers and lift up ways that we might be of assistance.

I participated last week, along with athletic director Jeff Swenson and assistant athletic director Kelly Anderson Diercks, in the annual convention of the National Collegiate Athletic Association (NCAA) in Atlanta. During the convention, the NCAA Division III, of which Augsburg is a proud member, launched a new identity initiative that will become public in the months ahead. This initiative, which will focus on the distinctive principles and values that characterize Division III colleges and universities—our commitments to student-athletes, to comprehensive educational experiences, to sportsmanship and citizenship, and to offering financial aid without reference to athletic accomplishments—will have a national debut in television spots and print ads, as well as in institutional and conference efforts. It is an important moment for Division III, and I look forward to Augsburg's role in telling the stories of our student-athletes who pursue all they do with passion and purpose.

Students can get the H1N1 vaccine at a walk-in clinic on Friday, Jan. 22., from 3 to 7 p.m. in the Marshall Room, Christensen Center, sponsored by the Minnesota Visiting Nurse Association. Cost for the vaccine is \$20.40 for the shot and \$13.31 for the nasal vaccine; students can either bring their health insurance information with them or pay for the vaccine with cash or a check. There is no need to sign up. Note: faculty and staff may also visit this clinic if they bring their insurance information or pay for the vaccine.
