First, the 22nd annual Nobel Peace Prize Forum brought more than 1,200 participants to campus as we hosted President Martti Ahtisaari, Prime Minister Kjell Magne Bondevik, Leymah Gbowee and other noted panelists to help us explore the idea of peacemaking as a "matter of will." It was a wonderful event, full of meaningful and serious conversation, education and inspiration. Many thanks to co-chairs Orv Gingerich and Frankie Shackelford, the planning committee, students, performers, and all who made it so successful.

Congratulations also to Katherine Edelen and Mai Yer Vang, who were selected as the 2010 Peace Scholars from Augsburg. Read about them below.

Next year's Peace Prize Forum will be held at Luther College, March 4–5, honoring the work of 2009 Peace laureate Barack Obama, with the theme, "Striving for Peace: Courage to Act."

And then to top off the weekend the Auggie wrestlers won their 11th NCAA Division III title in 20 years with eight All-Americans and three national runners-up. Congratulations also to head coach Mark Matzek, who became the youngest coach to be named Division III National Coach of the Year by the National Wrestling Coaches Association, and to Jared Evans, named Assistant Coach of the Year. Congratulations, Auggie wrestlers—we're proud of you!

I am saddened to announce the death of former faculty member and Distinguished Alumnus Neal Thorpe '60, who died last Wednesday. He taught biology and served as department chair at Augsburg for 22 years before beginning a second career in private philanthropy with the Murdock Charitable Trust.
