Good morning. On Friday, we complete spring semester classes for this academic year and move into final exams and Commencement activities. I'm excited that the day undergraduate class of 2010 began at Augsburg the same year I did – a milestone for all of us!

On Wednesday, the third annual Lavender Graduation highlights the accomplishments and contributions of Augsburg's LGBTQIA and allied students. It honors graduating students as well as the recipients of the Karen Neitge Scholarship and the LGBTQIA Leadership Award. The Neitge Scholarship is awarded to a student who has shown a commitment to issues of social justice, particularly in areas of gender expression, gender identity, and sexual orientation. The LGBTQIA Leadership Award goes to a student who has shown consistent leadership throughout the year around LGBTQIA activism, programming, scholarship, and service. The Lavender Graduation takes place at 5 p.m. in Oren Gateway Center.

On Friday, the Agre Challenge, at 3 p.m. in Murphy Square welcomes any and all spectators. Started by the Augsburg Chemistry Society (ACS) and honoring Auggie Nobel laureate Peter Agre, the Agre Challenge seeks to involve science and other departments in some departmental rivalry, appreciation, and fun. Students and faculty each year decide on a theme based in science but that could also include non-science students. This year, ACS and Engineers Without Borders (EWB) are co-sponsoring the challenge for teams to build the sturdiest bridge over a three-foot span using limited materials.

Next Sunday, we welcome and honor our donors and scholarship recipients at the annual Scholarship Brunch. In the past year, we've received 716 gifts to scholarships, totaling \$529,374, and have started eight new scholarships. Rev. Philip Formo will speak on behalf of donors, talking about the Jerome and Winifred Formo Music Scholarship, the Formos' new family scholarship honoring their parents. Peter Miller will speak on behalf of student scholarship recipients. This is a very popular and wonderful event, which gives our donors opportunities to meet many of the students who benefit from their generosity—so far, 260 people have responded to attend.

We begin the week tonight with the third annual Auggie Awards, celebrating the accomplishments of our student-athletes on and off the field. It's a formal awards gala, complete with a "maroon carpet."
