Good morning. Final exams begin today for day students who are completing their spring semester. **On Saturday we celebrate the first of our two Commencements**, both highlighting this year's theme of community and civic engagement. For this Commencement, 388 day students and 28 physician assistant master's degree students are eligible to graduate, including students from eight countries. During this week there are a number of events that celebrate the achievements of our students; information about them is listed in the events calendar below.

The Commencement speaker on Saturday will be Governor Tim Pawlenty. In addition, an honorary Doctor of Humane Letters degree will be conferred upon Father Fernando Cardenal, a Jesuit priest from Nicaragua who has committed his life and work to improving the lives of the poor through education and basic rights. He will speak about his vocational journey on Friday afternoon at 2 p.m. in the Century Room.

The Commencement on Sunday, June 27, will graduate students in Weekend College, Rochester, the partner hospitals programs, and the five master's programs of education, leadership, nursing, business administration, and social work. The scheduled speaker is Senator Amy Klobuchar; Peter Heegard will receive an honorary degree. He is a distinguished business and civic leader who founded and directs Urban Adventures, a community organization that educates young leaders in business about the issues and challenges of building healthy communities.

Next Monday's Update will be the last weekly update for this academic year. Through spring trimester and our June Commencement, we'll issue Updates every two weeks—on May 3, May 17, June 1 (Tuesday), June 14, and June 28. Over the summer, Updates will come out in mid-July and in mid-August.
