Good morning. I'm traveling this week to Berea College, in Berea, Kentucky, for the **20th-anniversary celebration of the Bonner Leaders Program**. Berea was the first campus with a Bonner program, which has now grown to more than 50 across the country. We are in our third year with the Bonner Leaders program, which selects 15-18 students each year to receive work-study scholarships to develop ongoing service and leadership opportunities in the community.

Bonner Program director Kristin Farrell, Bonner students Lexie Stadstad and Tara Sampson, and Sabo professor Garry Hesser and I will be at the celebration, at which time Garry will be honored for his continuing support of the Bonner program and service-learning, as will organizational partners Campus Kitchen and Kaleidoscope Place at Lutheran Social Services.

We received word last week that Senator Amy Klobuchar would be unable to speak at our June 27 Commencement, but I was delighted to announce that **Congressman Keith Ellison accepted our invitation to join us and speak to our theme of civic engagement**. I'll have more about Commencement in the next Update on June 14, but also want to mention that a Rochester Baccalaureate service for students there will take place on Thursday, June 17, at Bethel Lutheran Church, 7 p.m.

This year Staff Senate has expanded the Campus Beautification event to Community Service Days, to allow more people to give service to organizations in the community. On June 14–16, Augsburg community members are signed up to work at Feed My Starving Children, the community gardens, Project Linus, and Books for Africa. The summer picnic will be on Wednesday, June 16, at noon in Murphy Square. The Augsburg community is welcome.

I am sad to report the death of Distinguished Alumna Ruth A. Schmidt '52, who died last Monday, May 24, in Atlanta, Ga. She spent her entire life in academia and for 12 years served as the first female president of Agnes Scott College. She was passionate about international education and development, women's rights and initiatives, and peace advocacy. In 2000, Ruth's generous gift named the Anne Pederson Women's Resource Center, in memory of her former teacher.

Auggies compete in NCAA track and field national championships

Congratulations to the men's and women's track and field athletes who competed at the Division III NCAA National Championships at Baldwin Wallace College last week. Sophomore Rick Wolke capped a tremendous year by qualifying in two events—the 200-and 400-meter races—but was not able to advance to the finals in either one.

The women's 4x100 relay team finished fourth in their heat at the national championships, but also failed to move on to the final. It was the first time Augsburg has ever sent a 4x100 women's relay team to the national championship.

- Augsburg Advantage at St. Kate's Summer Transition program—a five-week program for eight students who have been studying in a skills program at St. Kate's. They are taking a Summer Session I course on campus and will continue at Augsburg in the fall semester. June 1–June 30.
- Youth Summer Theology Institute—In its seventh year, the institute brings high school students to campus with the purpose of expanding their theological imagination and to teach the students how to infuse theology into everyday life. June 13–18.
- Minnesota Private College Week—prospective high school students and their parents visit Augsburg during the week for tours and information. June 21–25.

- Minnesota Debate and Advocacy Workshop—Some of the best coaches and teachers in the state provide a camp experience in debate for youth, ages 13–18. June 27–July 13.
- **GEMS/GISE program** (Girls in Engineering, Mathematics, and Science and GISE Guys in Science and Engineering)—Middle- and high-school girls and boys from Minneapolis Public Schools are engaged in classes and activities on campus, with Augsburg student mentors working with them, July 6–29.
- Visit of students from United International College in China—Thirteen students and their group leader from UIC in Zhuhai, China—Augsburg's partner college—will be on campus during Summer Session II to take a course of their choice, plus a Minnesota Culture and History course. They will have a weekend home stay and travel to Duluth and the North Shore. July 9–Aug. 13.
- Summer Film Camp (ages 16–18)—Participants work with 16mm film as well as video and learn techniques for scripting, directing, and editing. July 11–17 and 18–24.
- Summer Bridge—a five-week residential program for admitted first-year Augsburg students who are TRiO/SSS eligible. Students take two courses, attend academic support seminars, workshops, and enjoy other social and cultural activities. July 12–Aug. 12.
- **SOAR I, II,** and **III**—First-year students and their parents spend two days on campus for orientation to the College and to campus life. July 23–24, 26–27, and 28–29.
- The Vocation of the Lutheran College (ELCA)—16th annual conference, "A Calling to Embrace the Neighbor: Lutheran Higher Education in the Midst of Religious Diversity," July 29–31.
- Scrubs Camp—A five-day experience on campus for students in grades 9–12 who are interested in exploring health careers. Presented by HealthForce Minnesota, Augsburg College, Cedar Riverside Partnership, Fairview Health Systems, and the University of Minnesota. August 1–5
