Good morning. On Thursday morning, we host the 2009 Koryne Horbal Lecture in our Convocation Series. Alicia Cabezudo, peace and human rights activist and educator from Argentina, will speak on the role of women in building peace in Latin America. She will also speak on Wednesday evening at the annual ACTC Women's Studies Faculty/Student Development Dinner hosted by the Women's Resource Center.

Now in its fifth year, the Koryne Horbal Lecture, sponsored by the Anne Pederson Women's Resource Center, honors the career and friendship of Ambassador Horbal, who received an honorary degree from Augsburg in 2008. Her support to the Women's Resource Center enables us to bring leaders to Augsburg whose work, like her own, has given voice to women's political and social issues around the world.

On Wednesday, we mark Augsburg's Founders Day during our daily chapel service, honoring our heritage as a college of the church in the city. In addition to special music from the Augsburg Choir, celebrating its 75th anniversary this year, my chapel homily will explore the relevance of Augsburg's history for our work today. Please join us at 10:20 a.m. on Wednesday for our special Founders Day chapel.

Later this week I leave for Moscow where Professor Magda Paleczny-Zapp, Business Administration Department chair, and I will meet with our partners at Sinerghia Economics and Finance Institute. We'll introduce a graduate program certificate to be offered to corporate employees in Moscow and discuss an option for Augsburg MBA students to visit businesses there.
