**Good morning.** I'm just back from Moscow, where Professor Magda Paleczny-Zapp, head of our business administration program, and I spent the last week strengthening our relationship with the Sinerghia Institute for Finance, our partner in offering the Augsburg MBA in Moscow. In addition to our meetings at Sinerghia, we also met with representatives of Russian companies, soliciting their assistance, both in recruiting students and in ensuring that our proposed program meets the needs for Russian business leaders. We likely will enroll a group of Russian students in a pilot MBA certificate program sometime next spring. Our trip reminds me of how relevant Augsburg's commitments to academic rigor, experiential education, and global citizenship are for responding to the needs for education around the world.

My congratulations to Augsburg's **Campus Kitchen program, which received the 2009 Outstanding Youth Award** from the Minnesota Chapter of the Association of Fundraising Professionals, presented Friday at Philanthropy Day.

Campus Kitchen is a highly successful program at Augsburg that embodies the College's vocational call to serve our neighbor and is now part of our Sabo Center for Citizenship and Learning. I also want to thank Augsburg alumna Beth Florence, who spoke on behalf of Campus Kitchen at the Philanthropy Day award presentation.
