PRESIDENT'S VIEWS

I have just returned from a weekend in Chicago, where my co-teacher, Lars Christiansen (Sociology and Metro-Urban Studies), and I accompanied 16 senior Honors students on an immersion trip as part of our course on The Legacies of Chicago. CAMPUS PROJECTS AND INITIATIVES

Torstenson Lecture on March 31

On Wednesday, the Fifth Annual Torstenson Lecture in Sociology will present Greg Owen, a consulting scientist at Wilder Research, who will speak on "Sociology as Vocation."

The Torstenson Lecture honors Joel S. Torstenson '38, professor emeritus of sociology, who died in 2007. Torstenson founded the Sociology Department in the late 1940s, and his work shaped much of Augsburg's emphasis on experiential education and identity as a college in the city.

Scholarship Brunch

On Sunday, nearly 250 donors, faculty, staff, and student scholarship recipients will gather to celebrate gifts from the Augsburg community that make an Augsburg education possible for so many students. Donors enjoy meeting the students who have received their scholarships, and students enjoy learning about the person or interests that the scholarships honor.

During the past year, 373 scholarships were awarded to students, for a total of more than \$723,000. Eight new scholarships were created in the past year, and a total of nearly \$883,000 from 350 donors was received.

ACTC Math Jeopardy

Students from Macalester and the University of St. Thomas responded to the call and will have teams competing, along with Augsburg, in two rounds of Math Jeopardy on Friday.
