CAMPUS PROECTS AND INITIATIVES

Former President of South Africa to keynote at 2012 Nobel Peace Prize Forum – We are honored to have F.W. de Klerk, former president of South Africa, as the keynote speaker at the Nobel Peace Prize Forum (NPPF) March 1 to 4, 2012.

This address marks the 23rd annual celebration of the Nobel Peace Prize Forum and the first year that the event will be organized and hosted by Augsburg College in its new Twin Cities-based format. We are honored to continue this event with the Humphrey School of Public Affairs, the support of our sister Norwegian Lutheran colleges, and our community partners who share our commitment to education for peace.

De Klerk, who won the 1993 Nobel Peace Prize with Nelson Mandela, is known for his work to end apartheid, a systemic policy of racial segregation. De Klerk supported the transformation of South Africa into a multi-racial democracy, and in recent years has continued his work on peacemaking efforts. Student Summer Orientation starts July 23 – About 400 hundred visitors are expected on campus July 23 to 28 during three Student Summer Orientation (SOAR) sessions. SOAR is a required two-day orientation for all incoming first-year students. The program helps students transition into Augsburg. Students meet with faculty, staff, and classmates; learn about college resources and services; get a fall semester schedule; and get a taste of life on campus. Youth campers explore sciences – Students in grades 4-8 are on campus through July 29 for the Girls in Engineering, Math, and Science (GEMS) camp and Guys in

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Science and Engineering (GISE) camp. This after-school program, which is connected to the Augsburg NASA Space Grant Program, primarily works with inner-city schools to give students a greater understanding of complex problem solving while learning about technology, science and mathematics. Campers scrub-in to learn about healthcare – Students in grades 9-12 will be on campus August 1 to 5 to learn about possible careers in the healthcare field, experience college for a few days, and become excited about their futures. Urban Scrubs Camp, in its second year at Augsburg, leverages partnerships among the College, Cedar-Riverside Partnership, and HealthForce Minnesota. About 60 students will explore healthcare fields through the lens of aging. Campers will get a first-hand understanding of the impacts of aging on the body by wearing "aging suits," learn about emergency care for heart-attack patients, study Native American herbal medicine, and make moulage, which is fake blood.
